ADULT FORUM: CULTIVATING CHRISTIAN MINDFULNESS

Stillness is a diminishing commodity in our lives, yet it is through stillness of body, mind, and soul that we strengthen our capacity to listen to God's voice. Mindfulness is a practice, grounded in stillness, that has been an integral element of religious and spiritual traditions for millennia. More recently, mindfulness has gained widespread attention in nonreligious settings, including mental health. In this four-week series we will explore: what mindfulness is (and isn't); the roots of mindfulness practice in the Christian historical tradition; how mindfulness seems to work in the brain and body; some basic techniques for cultivating a more mindful approach to life; and several contemporary practices of mindfulness-based Christian contemplative prayer.
